 to be buried in such manner at the discretion of my executor hereafter named And for my
 worldly goods I have devised and bequeathed that is to say First I give to the poor of St. Dunstons Church
 twenty shillings to be distributed unto them in the day of my funeral Also I give to the
 my dear the half of all my landed goods being within my diocese of London and the suburbs
 thereof and such other my lands and tenements as I have devised unto my dear daughter and I do devise
 my lands to each of them forty shillings a year to be paid unto them within one year next after
 my decease Also I give unto my daughter Isabella forty shillings a year during her life to be
 paid unto her at two payments viz twenty shillings on the first and twentieth day of March
 and twenty shillings on the first and twentieth day of September Also I give unto her two chil-
 dren forty shillings a year to be paid unto them within one year after my decease Also I give
 to my daughter Martha twenty shillings and to her two children forty shillings forty
 shillings a year to be paid unto them within one year next after my decease Also I give
 unto my daughter Mary five hundred pounds to be paid unto her within one year next after my decease
 Also I give unto my son Thomas the fourth of the said lands of my dear daughter lying together at
 farther end of the manor called Lathay and one little hamlet there called in the occupation of
 Simon Rogers to have and to hold to him his heirs and assigns with all appurtenances
 which the same appurtenances touching and growing for and during the term of five years to
 come from the first and twentieth day of March next after my decease Also I give unto my son
 Ralph five hundred pounds and to his daughter forty shillings to be paid unto them within one year
 next after my decease Also I give unto my son Thomas and his children the third of the said manor
 John twenty pounds a year to be paid unto each of them when they shall accomplish the age of four
 and twenty years And the rest of my goods and chattels not herein bequeathed I give unto my
 son Thomas his heirs and assigns whom I make my sole executor in and with witness here of I have given
 with my hand and seal the day and year above written published heard and read in the presence
 of John Wood Ralph Blighy.

This will was proved at London
 the second day of May in the year of our Lord God one thousand six hundred and sixty before
 the judges for probate of wills and granting of administration lawfully authorized By the
 oath of Thomas Blighy the said son and sole executor named in the said will who was
 committed administration of all and singular the goods chattels and debts of the said
 deceased being first sworn by Commission truly to administer.

In the name of God Amen I the said
 Thomas Foster
 in the year 1660 after coming to the computation of the said will of Thomas
 Foster executor named in the said will being lame and unable in body but of perfect
 memory and remembrance prayed by God do make and ordain this my last will and tes-
 tament in manner and form following viz I first bequeath my soul into the hands of
 Almighty God my maker hoping that through the merits death and passion of my only
 Saviour and Redeemer Jesus Christ to receive free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins
 And as for my body I bequeath it to be buried in the churchyard in St. Dunstons Church at the
 discretion of my executor hereafter nominated of my family purchased of William Bayly
 being viz three and a half lying in the middle and bounds of great Chancery in the County of
 Huntingdon and Leicestershire and bequeath the profits of it unto my youngest daughter
 Elizabeth during her natural life And after her decease I give and bequeath the profits of the
 said land unto my second daughter Francis if she survive and lend to my son during his life And
 after her decease I give the profits of the said land wholly and wholly unto my son
 Thomas the wife of Thomas Good and to his heirs and assigns forever I give to Richard
 Thoms the clerk of my son Thomas above named with condition to pay unto my family the sum of 10
