Learns my daughter and to Jane Allen my daughter
Two shilling A piece of servant English money
After my deathe

Item I Give to my son James of my house and to Mary
James my daughter and to Jane Allen my daughter
two shilling A word of servant Englishman
After my death
All the rest of my Goods and Chattels Give & Be-
queath unto my wife Mary and do make her full
Exe^{cut}or of this my Last will and After her
my debts be paid What she shall stand to be
After to be Equally divided Among my children
In such way as how oft I have hereto set my hand
