I Henry Culse of Spinnington in the County of South Devon Esq^r being
of sound and perfect mind and disposing memory thank be to God
for the same Do make and ordain this to be my last Will and testament
in manner and form following (that is to say) first and principally I
commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and
my body I commit to the earth from whence it came to be decently
buried at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named, and for my
lawful estate I give and dispose of the same as followeth (that is to say)
I give and devise unto my sonne William Culse All my lands of
Inheritance To hold to him and his heirs and assigns forever from &
me unto my sonne Henry Culse the summe of Eight hundred pounds
to be paid by my Executor hereafter named within six months after
he shall attain his age of One and Twenty years and my Will is that
from the time of my death but till the said Eight hundred pounds shall become
payable there shall be paid to my said sonne Henry the summe of forty
pounds per Annum for his maintenance and education from & give unto
Thomas Dinkley Esq^r and Edward Cooper Esq^r for the use of my
daughter Katherine the summe of five hundred pounds, with which said
five hundred pounds my will is the said Thomas Dinkley and Edward
Cooper shall purchase One Annuity or Rentcharge of as great a
yearly value as can be gotten for the same for and during the term of the
naturall life of my said daughter and for the sole and only benefit and
advantage of my said daughter during her naturall life And my will is that
but till such an Annuity or Rentcharge shall be purchased as aforesaid
my said daughter shall have her maintenance out of the interest and
product of the said five hundred pounds, and in case the said five hundred
pounds shall not presently after my death be laid out in the purchase of
such Annuity or rentcharge as aforesaid nor be put out at interest, and
that the said five hundred pounds shall remain in the hands of the said
said Thomas Dinkley and Edward Cooper In such case my will is that
my said daughter shall have her maintenance out of the said five hundred

pounds provided that such maintenance shall not exceed Thirty pounds
in one year; and if my said daughter shall happen to die before such
Annuity or rent charge shall be purchased as aforesaid, then my will is
that the said five hundred pounds shall be paid back to my said Executor
hereafter named, Item I give unto my servant Sir Robert Sparman Twenty
pounds to be paid in six months after my decease. Item all the rest of my lands
Tendments woods and Chattells whatsoever not before given or bequeathed
I doe hereby give and bequeath unto my said Sonne William his heirs -
Executors and Administrators And I doe make my said Sonne William Executor
of this my will And I doe hereby revoke disannull and make void all former
Wills by mee made In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and
seale the One and Twentieth day of July Anno 1573 Willelmus Dux
Anglie Henricus Tulse. Signed Sealed published and declared by the said
Edward Tulse to be his last Will and Testament in the presence of one
his honor first entered Henry Sparman Clerk: Sparman the mark of
Robert White Clerk Tulse man.

Item I make Grace my deare and loving wife sole Executrix of this my
last Will, and I will that she pay and discharge all my Debts funeral -
Expenses and charges of Probat of this my will, and of the performance
thereof and all my Legacies hereinafter specified And all the rest of
my estate real and personall chattells goods debts monyes rights and
credits I give and bequeath to my said wife Item to my three daughters
Anne Grace and Susanna I give and bequeath to each of them Thirt
hundred pounds of lawfull money of England a peece to be paid to them
respectively as soon as conveniently may be after my decease and their
respective receipts for the same to be sufficient discharges to my Executrix
Item I give to my sister Joane Templman of Linne Twenty pounds and
to my sister Lydia Sandford Widow of Linne Twenty pounds and to
her sonne Thomas Sandford five pounds and to my sister Anne Buckland
wife of William Buckland of Lynne five pounds these four Legacies
to be paid in convenient time after my decease In witness whereof I have
hereunto sett my hand and seale Dated the day and year first above
