Margarette his wife being sick in his bedd did freely and voluntarily and in the name of God utter and declare his last will and Testament in these words following and to the same effect (vizt) I give half of my goods unto my wife, And also I doe give the halfe of my lands to my wife, I doe give the other halfe of my goods to my sonnes Christopher and Thomas and my daughters equally, And I doe make Robert my son Executor of this my will. This will formerly sett downe was uttered and declared by the aforesaid Christopher Sutton his son in his presence. Edw. Blunt wit saunter

Thomas Lord Arundell of Wardour Castle in the Countie of Wilts whereby I doe appoint that my bodie be committed to the earth in such manner as hee bodie of my father Sir Mathew Arundell was without any vain ostentation. And I doe nominate appoint and intrust my good friend William Deastry of London Esq. and John Morgan of Wiltshire in the Countie of Middlesex gent to be my Executors and to take upon them that care and burthen which belongeth to the entry of Executors. And in Testimonie thereof I have hereunto putt my hand and seal the fiftie day of November in the fiftenth year of the reign of King Charles over England &c Anno Dni one thousand six hundred thirtie nyne Tho: Arundell Sealed and delivered in the presence of George Barber Rich: Peesley William Smith D. Hallenoba John Butmarche John Ellis.
