 James Leigh formerly of
 Galloway and the County of
 Southampton but late of Greenham
 in the Parish of St Nicholas in the
 County of Berks Esquire deceased
 left administered by Anna
 Leigh Widow, the Relict and
 Ephraim Miller Esquire decd
 whilst living the Executors named
 in the said Will was granted
 to Charles Robert Surber of London
 Esq in the City of London
 as person for that purpose named
 by and on the part and behalf
 of William Currie of East Herts
 in the County of Surrey Esquire
 and Charles Smith of Hutton
 in the County of Essex Esquire
 limited, so far as concerns all
 the Right Title and Interest of
 himself said James Leigh deceased
 in and to a certain messuage
 Farm Lands Hereditaments and
 Premises situate lying and being
 in the Parishes of Wettle and
 Broomfield one of them in the
 said County of Essex with the
 Appurtenances comprised in the
 two certain Terms of five hundred
 Years and four hundred Years
 and the Remainder of the said
 two several Terms granted and
 to the said James Leigh in and by
 a certain Indenture of three parts
 bearing date the 17th Day of February
 1769 and now to come and
 unexpired therein and all benefits
 and Advantages to be had received
 and taken therefrom but not
 further or otherwise over any

will contained in our sheet of paper at my hands
 and seal the twenty first day of November in the year
 of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty
 two Jas Leigh Esq signed sealed published and attested
 by the said James Leigh as and for his last will and
 testament in the presence of us who at his request
 in his presence and in the presence of each other have
 subscribed our names as witnesses thereto Saml Wadson

This Will was proved at London the twenty first
 day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand
 seven hundred and eighty seven before the Worshipful
 William Graham Doctor of Laws Surrogate of the
 Right Worshipful Peter Calvert Doctor of Laws Master
 Surper or Commissary of the Probogative Court of
 Canterbury lawfully constituted by the oath of any
 single widow the widow of the deceased and the
 Executor named in the said will to whom administration
 was granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and
 Credits of the said deceased having been first sworn

 war and this case do publish and declare this my last
 will testament in manner and form following (that
 is to say) my body I commit to the Earth or sea as shall
 please God to order and as to my worldly goods and
 all other sum and sums of money whosoever shall be
 possessed by me or entitled unto at the time of my death
 I give devise and bequeath the same unto my
 daughter Catherine Lampard at my James Esq's or
 brother and sister at Ryebury in Gloucestershire for
 her sole and separate use and benefit and do hereby
 appoint my said daughter Catherine Lampard sole
 executrix of this my last will and as to my clothing
 Arcturion and what my box and Baggage
 contains I leave to my Executors and in case of my
 daughter's death I will and bequeath the above

to the manner whatsoever
 having been first sworn duly
 to administer the said James
 Miller and did Intestate

pay prize money and all other sum or sums of my
widow due at my decease unto my sister Sarah and
relatives of the parish of East Droye in the County of
Wiltshire for their proper administration and all
aliquis and lastly I do revoke all former wills by me ere

subscribed set my hand and seal this fifth day of
April in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred

This Will was proved at London the twenty sixth
day of February in the Year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred and eighty three before the Right
Worshipful Peter Calvert Doctor of Laws Sir John Cooper
or Comptroller of the Privy Council Court of Canterbury
lawfully constituted by the oath of Catherine Lampard
wife of Charles Lampard the daughter of the deceased
and sole executrix named in the said will to whom
administration was granted of all and singular the
Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased it
having been first sworn duly to administer &c
